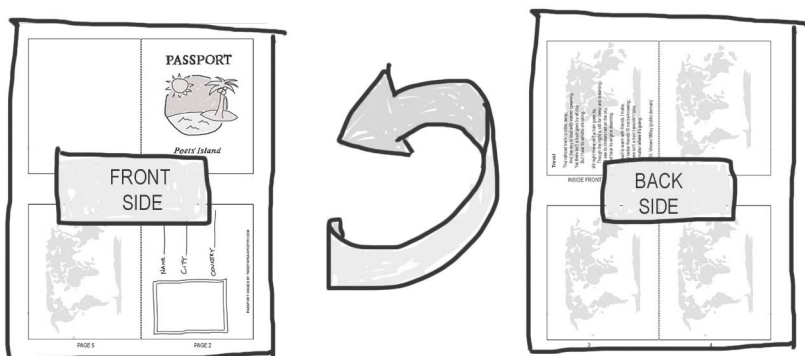


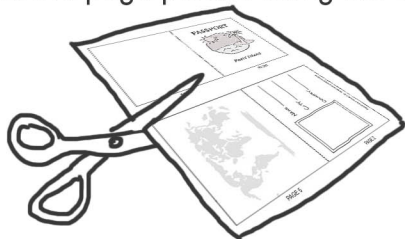
How to use your Poets' Island Passport from Tweetspeak Poetry

Have fun and track your poetry submissions internationally with your Poets' Island passport.

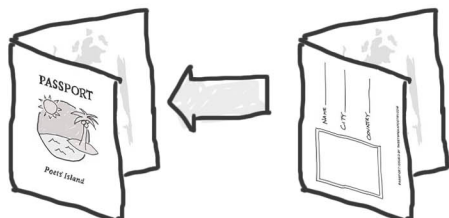
1. Print the front side of the passport on a sheet of 8.5x11 paper.
2. Feed the newly-printed page into your printer for double-sided printing and print the back side on the same sheet.



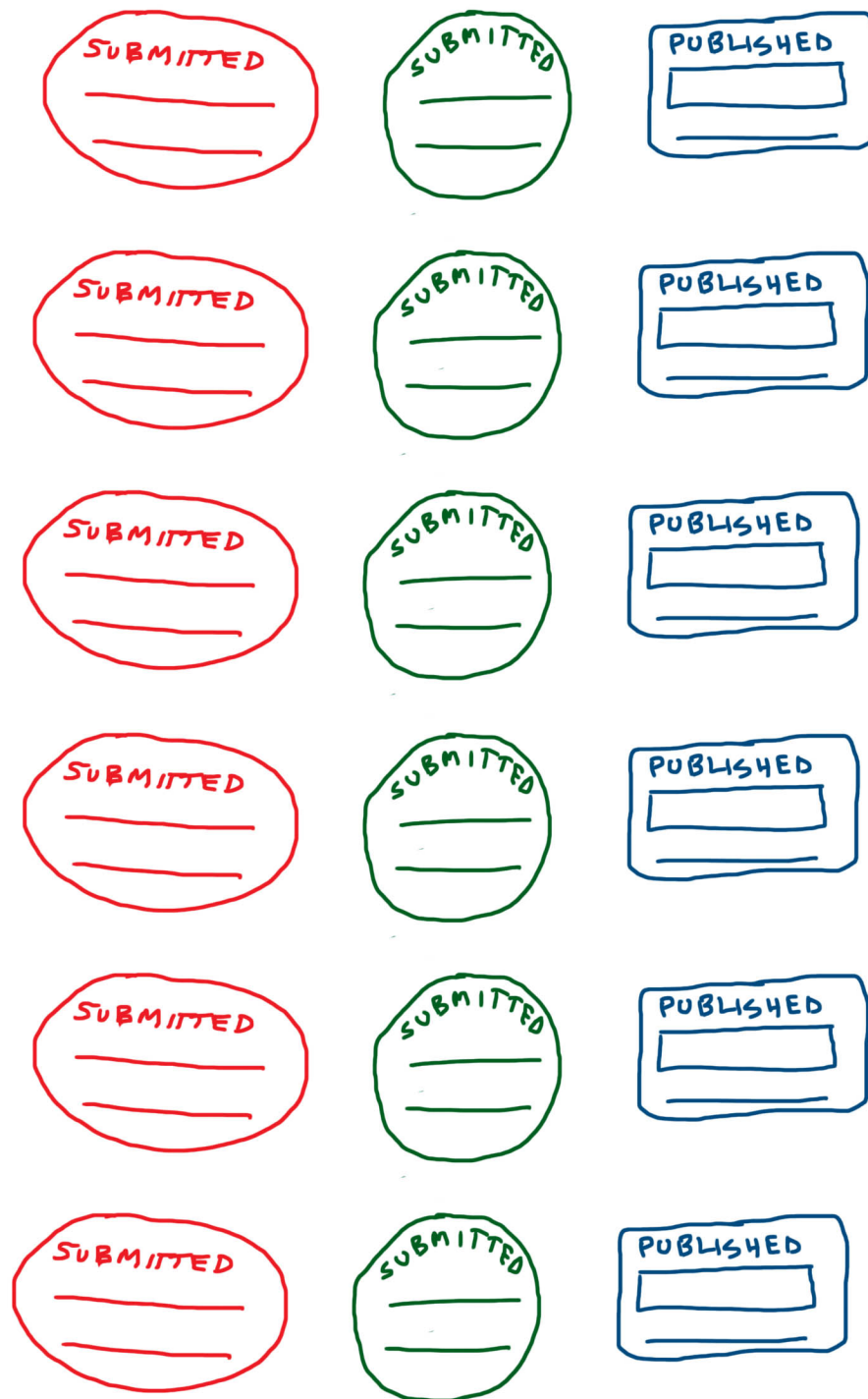
3. Cut the page panels along the solid lines.



4. Fold along dotted line and assemble.

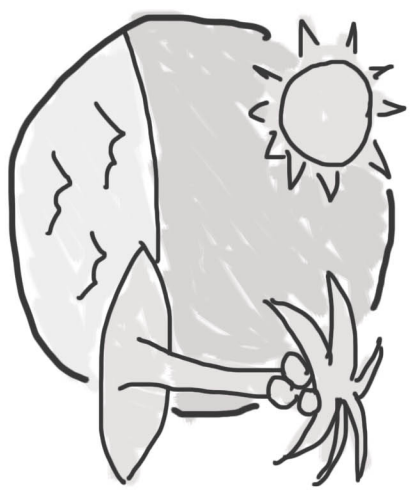


Cut out, label, and paste in stamps as you visit various countries through your submissions.
